No one is standing and who will help us where this is thought, right there our organization holds the hands of the children and tries with full dedication to reach their destination.

We have also taken our small step forward in the Saran district of Bihar by starting a health check-up camp through Mobile One and a free check-up camp program by a local NGO which is still running and from this the village. People who could not go to the city to get their treatment are benefiting from the mobile van, taking treatment and offering prayers to us. In Mirzapur Panchayat and Murarpur village of Laladpur block of the district, road repair and road construction were done and all the workers who joined in the work were helped by us with a winter kit so that those people in the cold. We can take care of our children by wearing mosquito nets and good clothes. At the same time, we have to be our railway heads donors, and partners. Will and will continue to deliver their work to the needy.

By strategically aligning our initiatives with the Sustainable Development Goals, we have worked on a five-year strategic plan for 2024-2029, which builds on the achievements of the past and positions us for future success.

Rehabilitation Services

Physiotherapy

GRIRR believes in the power of person-centred care to transform lives. Our cutting-edge therapy services are designed to help an individual enhance their full potential. The expert team of physiotherapists work with dedication and commitment to help regain strength, mobility & independence. The services cover children who come to our Centre walking on their own feet and they are taking service at a fee of 12 rupees a day and many children are getting better because of this.



Occupational Therapy

Occupational therapy. This is very important for the rehabilitation field. It supports us for children who have autism, down syndrome or mental retardation. Dance and drums are given to these children. Tasks such as brushing by oneself, bathing by oneself, dressing by oneself, going to the toilet by oneself, cleaning the toilet by oneself, and daily tasks of their needs are taught so that the children can do their work without being dependent on others. They brush themselves, wear their clothes, and bathe themselves. Occupation therapy tries to make the child independent and reduce their hyperactivities. It improves the child to a great extent. And our guardians are very impressed with this service.

Special education

Special education is given to children who can't speak, can't hear, are hyperactive, and have intracultural impairment so that they can do their daily work by themselves and we enrol them in schools near their homes. After admission, our special educators' team takes responsibility for completing their syllabus so that they can pass their exams and move to another class. After seeing the mood of the children, they are taught by mixing yes with them so that those children also support the special educators on this and can listen to their words.



Speech Therapy

Speech Therapy plays an important role in the rehabilitation field. We have seen that most of our children are children with cerebral palsy, Autism, Down syndrome and speech and hearing are coming to our center for rehabilitation, Who cannot speak the language of their mothers and fathers. Children who do not understand have a lot of difficulty in explaining or telling their parents, so our therapist has facilitated the language and communication of their children by giving speech therapy on this so that these children can express their needs to their parents. Language plays an important role in the human body through which we can tell our heart's thoughts to our brothers and sisters and relatives through which people understand our needs. Can and help us GRIRR started this service keeping this in mind so that children can share their feeling with us and their parents and it has been seen that we are getting very good result in this till now.

Aids and appliances (Prosthesis and Orthosis)

Aids and appliance development has an important role in the field of rehabilitation by which children can maintain their foot posture of the hands and foot. It started making Aids and Appliances for the beneficiaries of GRIRR, through which children with different disabilities grew into good sleep and its Aids & appliances greatly help children with tightness and deformities. It also provides external support to the children in their walking, especially those whose feet are very weak. It has been observed that the fitting of these children is a problem, their appliances used to be smaller because other NGOs took the casting and measurement six months ago and the children's feet are large. Seeing this, we started our orthopedics workshop and are making and giving sum appliances to our children according to their needs.

Women Empowerment

Tailoring training GRIRR started a tailoring trading center for the mothers of their major children in 2021 which had 40 mothers but after the lockdown, we have 120 families who do not have husbands, especially widows. And children who have no fathers in this world were started for their mothers and they were recruited for income generation work so that they could sew and take care of their older children along with the older children. His other brothers and sisters were also raised and educated and made a good human being. After that, when the production of masks stopped, we used to take orders from the local garment workers of Matiaburuz and sew them and give them to them so that these mothers could earn and feed their children two meals a day. We have also trained the major youth boys or girls above 18 years of age to support their member family members by sewing and earning money like their brothers and sisters and getting an equal share in the house, do it.

CDAK badhte kadam skill training

Another initiative was taken by GRIRR in 2022 where the young unemployed youths who have passed the Madhyamik examination of 10+2 and are roaming around for a job are not finding any. They were not getting any institute, they were not getting guidance, so an institute called CDAK scanned 348 children after counselling these children, they were given hotel management.

Basic training was given after that, John was sent to Barbeque Nation for six months for these principles, in which the youth were given a Rs3000 stipend per month. After that, they were given jobs in other hotels, some in Bangalore, some in Hyderabad, some in Mysore, some in schemes, some children were given jobs in different estates. Are supporting and the Guardian is very happy to see their children succeed.



Health Camps and Relief work

CFW (Community Field Work) BY GOONJ

In 2022 and 23, GRIR started a campaign of road repairing and cleaning of some drains and creeks in Mirzapur Panchayat Gram Mararpur of Laladpur Block of Saran District. In which around 450 people worked together. Those who were in need were the ones who worked. In exchange for this cleaning and road repairing work, we gave them a winter kit to avoid the cold, which was supported by Goonj. Sweaters for children, sweaters for adults, clothes for children and clothes for adults, slippers, soap and other necessities were provided.



Mobile medical Van

In 2022 and 2023 in Lahladpur Block Gram Panchayat Mirzapur and Gram Murarpur Village of Saran District, we started a mobile health check-up program in which the General Physician and Akhan Jati Hospital sourced the examination and He also organized a cataract surgery camp in which about 100 people underwent cataract surgery and more than 500 people were consulted by the general physician. It has not been done yet and it is still going on continuously and the support of donor and valuation has been continuous and will continue. Our target is that we are throwing other organizations tomorrow if any valuation is always put for this village. There is a plan to arrange a separate mobile sister and an ambulance, we will do this in the future.



Eye Check-up Camp

Free cataract surgery camp

For the first time Free Eye Cup and Cataract operation camp was conducted in Mararpur village in which 110 people benefited from the total service 15 people were referred for cataract surgery and 70 people were given spectacles. When we started the work, we saw that there were a lot of old and weak people in the village who did not have a simple way to go to the Sadar Hospital and show themselves. Given this, we conducted 10 camps within six months in the entire Marjapur panchayat, out of which 500 people

showed their eyesight and 154 people underwent cataract surgery in this village. There is a place where people can show themselves and get spectacles or cataract surgery. If a weak person needs something, then they have to go to Sadar Hospital. Due to this reason, it is more than six months and they do not have cataract surgery, so on the request of the people, we organized this establishment and it is still running continuously and will continue in the same way.



Success Stories

1. Sk. Farhan Ali, Cerebral Palsy

Before: He was only 2 years old, when he came to GRIRR, he was not able to sit and stand without support, no speech was present, not able to hold the objects.

After: With physiotherapy & special education, now he run and participate in sports, speak in sentence, read and write and play with friends.

2. Ayan Alam, Rickets (Severe)

Before: Due to weakness of the lower limb, he was not able to stand and walk, his ribs and wrist bone were prominent and deformed.

After: Physiotherapist planned a therapy, followed by vitamin medicine, diet and orthosis. So, at the age of 4 years, he was able to stand and started walk with support. Now he can run like any other child of his age.



3. Rounak Khatoon, Torticollis

Before: Her neck was deformed in one side, she cannot move her neck from birth, because her neuro and spinal nerves were intertwined. Two operations were prescribed but her parents did not have the fund for the operation, the result is that she was unable to turn her head, speak or respond.

After: Just when things appeared hopeless, her parents turned to the NGO GRIRR. GRIRR put her on strict physiotherapy regime. Ronak is now almost recovered, she can turn her neck like others. She can speak and respond. She is currently undergoing tuitions and will be enrolling in a school.
